Cobourg Police Service Trespass Authority Agent Program

The Cobourg Police Service is standardizing the documentation of authorization to enforce the Trespass to Property Act (hereinafter referred to as "the Act").

As stated in section 2(1)(b) of the Act, the occupier of a premise may extend their authorization to persons other than the occupier. This option is voluntary and at the discretion of the property owner/occupier. This letter is not meant to solicit or influence any person or business.

Should an owner or occupier of a property in the Town of Cobourg wish to extend their authorization for enforcement of the Act to the Cobourg Police Service, they must complete their intention on the attached letter and return the original copy at 107 King Street West, Cobourg, Ontario. Letters not received on the official form will not be accepted.
